Rules & Regulations

STREAM A: Case Study Presentation

1. Only one team of students from class IX-XII shall represent one institution.
2. Each team shall be allotted a time slot of 15 minutes
3. This time shall include the following activities:
 - a) Setting up of the Stage.
 - b) Introduction by the Circle Leader.
 - c) Presentation.
 - d) Concluding remarks by the Moderator.
 - e) There shall be questions from the floor for about 2 minutes after each presentation
4. In view of the above, the teams are advised to plan their presentations for 15 minutes and are requested to cooperate with the organizers to adhere to the time schedule.
5. A warning bell shall be rung at the expiry of 13 minutes of the presentation. The second bell shall be rung indicating the end of the time of the presentation.
6. Upon ringing of the warning bell, the team should immediately start to round off their presentation.
7. The number of participants in the Case Study Presentation should be 5 - 10.
8. One soft copy should be submitted in C.D in the convener's office by Monday, 21st October 2013.
9. Marks shall be awarded for the selection of Topic, Planning of the Case Study, Implementation & Presentation Style.

STREAM B: Collage Competition

Theme: Purpose of Life: "Loving and Serving"

1. ONE team of students from class IX-XII shall represent each institution.
2. Each team shall comprise of TWO participants.
3. Time allotted shall be 2 hours.
4. The participants of each team shall present one collage collectively to project the given theme.
5. The participants are free to use any material for giving any extra effects to their project.
6. At the venue, the organizers shall provide only black/ white charts, standard size. (22 x27), as per the choice of the participants. Soft boards shall also be provided for display.
7. Marks will be deducted, if materials are cut with scissors.
8. Marks shall be awarded for Creativity, Neatness and Interpretation of the theme.

STREAM C: Debate Competition

Topic: Social Media Strengthens Relationships

1. Each team of students from class IX-XII shall be represented by TWO speakers, one speaking for the motion and other against it.
2. Each speaker shall be allowed to present his / her views within three minutes.
3. A warning buzzer shall be sounded after two and a half minutes. A final buzzer shall be sounded indicating the end of the stipulated time.
4. Points shall be deducted if the speaker exceeds the time limit of three minutes.
5. There shall be a lively rebuttal for approximately two minutes after each speech with interjections from the participants and the audience.
6. Points shall be awarded on the basis of Content, Delivery and Pronunciation.

STREAM D: Poster and Slogan Competition

Theme: Future is Innovation

1. ONE team of students from class VI to VIII shall represent each institution.
2. Each team shall comprise of TWO participants.
3. The participants of each team shall work collectively to present an attractive poster. They should also write a slogan to project the given theme.
4. The time allotted for the competition shall be two hours.



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STREAM D: Poster and Slogan Competition

Theme: Future is Innovation

5. Participants shall bring their own poster colours and brushes.
6. At the venue, the organizer shall provide white charts, standard size (22x27). arrangements shall be made for display of the posters.
7. The poster shall be judged on the basis of Creativity, Neatness, and Interpretation of the theme.
8. After the display, these posters shall be retained by the organizers

STREAM E: Story Forming

Theme: Tell your Tale

1. ONE team comprising of THREE students from Class VI to VIII shall represent each institution.
2. A few objects or materials shall be placed before the participants by the organizers. They shall be clearly marked with names or titles.
3. The participants shall be required to form a story in 45 minutes.
4. The following points shall be kept in mind while forming the story.
 - i. The story should have a title, theme, setting, plot and a moral.
 - ii. The participants shall use exact names of items in their stories as labeled by the organizers.
 - iii. The word limit for each story shall be 300 words.
 - iv. The participants shall write the first draft of the story on a sheet of paper.
 - v. These drafts shall be presented to the panel of judges who will choose 10 best stories for the final round.
5. The organizers shall provide chart papers and markers to the TEN selected teams to write the story.
6. Drawings and illustrations can be drawn along with the story.
7. Teams shall bring their own stationery items like pen, pencil, colors, notepad etc.
8. Each chosen team shall get 6 minutes to read out the story orally before the judges.
9. Points shall be awarded on the basis of Expression, Content and Creativity

STREAM F: Paper Presentation (By Students)

Theme: Democratic System Demands Democratic Values

1. ONE student from class IX to XII shall represent each institution.
2. A maximum of 5 minutes shall be allotted for each presentation.
3. The content of the paper should be relevant to student's performance; and the examples should be chosen from their own experiences.
4. The paper shall not exceed the word limit of 400 words
5. The participants can also give the presentation in the Power Point format, if they want to do so.
6. In case of oral presentation marks will be deducted for paper reading
7. The students may use charts or other audio visual materials.
8. Marks shall be deducted for exceeding the time limit.
9. A soft copy of the paper should reach the organizers by 21st October, 2013.
10. Judgment will be done on the basis of Relevance, Style and Uniqueness of approach.

STREAM G: Quiz Competition

1. ONE team comprising of TWO students from Class IX to XII shall represent each institution.
2. Booklet of questions for quiz competition will be provided by organizers on demand.
3. A preliminary Written Round of 15 minutes duration will be conducted to choose top five teams from all the participating institutions.
4. The top five teams will compete in three rounds.
5. The 1st Round will be oral round. Five questions will be asked from each team. Each correct answer will be awarded five points.
6. The 2nd Round will be a buzzer round. In this round each question will be open to every team. The team that presses the buzzer first will have the right to answer the question. Five points will be awarded for each correct answer. Negative marking will be done in case of an incorrect answer.
7. The 3rd Round will be a rapid fire round. The team leader will answer the questions in this round. Each team will be asked a maximum of ten questions in a minute. Each right answer will be awarded ten points. The team will have an option to pass on any two questions in case they cannot answer it. No further questions will be asked if a third question is passed on.
